Letter from Lendon Gray

Welcome riders, parents, trainers, friends and relatives to the 23rd Annual Youth Dressage Festival!

Congratulations to the winner of our art contest, MacKenzie Pearl from Atkinson, Maine, whose artwork is on the program cover. I love this part of our show. Our programs are always fun and unique.

We have so many wonderful volunteers, some who have been with us since the first festival in 1999. How incredibly lucky we are to have people who give up their vacation time, their family time, their horse time to help you out. Conducting this event is a year-round process. Being a part of the Organizing Committee does not require one to live near, or travel to, Bedford NY, the headquarters of D4K. Our committee ranges from Maine to Florida, and we are always looking for new people to help keep this show going as well as other D4K activities like the Weekend Equestrian Program and the TEAM clinics.

Everyone please take notice of our generous and loyal sponsors. We are very fortunate to have so many people who want to assist us in our activities. Obviously without them we wouldn't exist. Don't be shy about thanking them, please. And give a special shout out to the sponsors who have been with us for 23 straight years (Theresa Davidson, Wendy Luscombe, and Trafalgar Square Publishing), and to those sponsors who have been with us for ten or more years (Sam Grunkorn, Hampton Green Farm, Rhinebeck Equine, and The Cheshire Horse).

Part of being a good competitor is learning to adapt to the weather. So, everyone please watch out for each other – drink lots of water and don't wear coats if it's hot. The judges do NOT want to see you struggling with the heat under a coat.

Let's make sure that our wonderful equines are first and foremost in our plans. Do what you can to make sure that they have a comfortable, clean, quiet stall with water at all times; remember that part of what makes our show special is that it is based on horsemanship, which means putting their health and comfort first. Their feeding schedule should be as close as possible to what they have at home. Take them for a graze when you can. Don't sit on them and use them as couches. If you aren't actually riding, get off and hold them. If the weather is hot, find ways to keep them cool. We have stable managers walking through the stables checking on everything. Feel free to ask them questions.


Let each one of us do everything we can to make this a great few days for everyone. Take a moment now to think about what needs to happen for you to have fun, and then you take responsibility to make it happen for those around you. This might involve helping a fellow competitor or a volunteer with their work, thanking as many people as you can, cheering up someone having a tough day, helping your child learn how to lose graciously, seeing a problem and coming forth to help solve it. I hope everyone will say as they drive out the gate, "Wow, that was a fun couple of days!"

For those who take home medals and ribbons, my heartiest congratulations. For those who maybe don't have their best days of competition, hey, that happens to all of us. I hope you have fun anyway. I had some really disastrous competitions in my day but still made two Olympic teams. The one dressage test sheet I have kept from all my years of competing is the one where I got a 38%! There are lots of ways to win: Overcome a difficulty, be a super sport, have your horse stand still in the halt for the first time, do your first test ever in the pouring rain, keep smiling even though you just did the worst test of your life.

Letter from Lendon Gray, continued

Here are some notes for you to remember this weekend:

- *No matter what we do, we cannot guarantee a perfect sound system, so please help out. This means planning ahead, reading all notices, and especially passing on any announcements you hear to everyone you run into. Check the bulletin boards regularly.
- *Once again, each rider is expected to be prepared to get to the proper ring at the proper time. Our stewards are there to try to keep things safe and to let you know if the ring is running early or late. They are not there to tell you when you go, or who you are after, etc. Have a piece of paper in your pocket with your ride time and the numbers of the three riders are ahead of you; Make sure you let the steward know that you are there. The stewards will tell you when you may go around the competition arena. They will not go looking for you or yell out your number. It is your responsibility to be ready.
- *If you do not have a trainer and would like help with your warm-up please check at the office or find Lendon.
- *Any bicycle rider endangering or annoying horses, riders or pedestrians will be banned from riding their bicycle on the grounds. Remember horses and pedestrians have the right of way over bicycles. Ride slowly please. There are to be NO bicycles in the barn aisles or by the doors into the barns.
- *Remember only licensed drivers may drive golf carts.
- *Parade of teams please respect parents and sponsors and dress in riding or team attire.
- *Check for any schedule changes on bulletin board after 7 a.m. each day.
- *There is no value to continually asking when scores will be posted!
- *If you have any special requests or you question a score you must go to the Appeals Committee: contact Fern Feldman.
- *Remember to thank the volunteers and your parents!





Joy Black has been writing the written tests for the Youth Dressage Festival since around 2007. Joy is a full-time physician assistant and on the side, has been a professional test writer for the NCCPA an organization certifying physician assistants through a national exam. She has found it a pleasure to use her test writing skills for Dressag4Kids. Joy has ridden most of her life, is a USDF L graduate, and will be competing at 3rd level on her horse Bimini. She is originally from Burlington, VT and trained with Carol Lavell as a youth. Joy lives near Albany, NY.



Karry Bengtson-Brothers is a USDF L Graduate with Distinction, USDF Bronze Medalist, USEF "r" Western Dressage judge, part of the management team for NEDA's judge education program and is currently raising her next dressage partner, Lachlan (Everdale x Wynton), a stunning 5 year old KWPN bred by Rhodes Farm. Her focus is on biomechanics of both horse and rider and how they affect each other, particularly in dressage. Karry owns Emerald Glen in Stephentown NY, where the focus of the riding programs are on horsemanship, sportsmanship, and kindness. She currently works with horses of all different types and riders with all different abilities and emphasizes that there is always more to learn!



Sherree Cushner started out her horse career trail riding, then moved into the hunter/jumper world. But jumping high fences was not something that she wanted to do, so when Anne Gribbons started giving group dressage lessons, she signed up. That was the start of her love affair with dressage. Over the years, Sherree has had the opportunity to work with several of the ex-cavalrymen, like Major Buttykay, Major Carmona, General Burton and Colonel Wimert. Additionally, she worked with Dr Gahwyler, Marilyn Payne and most recently Kathy Adams. Sherree's long term partner was a wonderful Dutch horse named Zenit. Zenit had been purchased as a schoolmaster to teach Sherree. They formed a wonderful partnership, earning Sherree her USDF Medals, and Zenit his Performance Certificate at Grand Prix, along with multiple national year end awards at the FEI levels. Sherree is an "L" program graduate "with distinction', and therefore can judge at schooling shows. She enjoys judging and particularly helping participants understand and improve, through meaningful comments.



Madeleine Debure - Originally from France, Madeleine Debure has been living in the USA since 2006. She owns and operates Free Walk Dressage, a small training and sales barn located an hour north of New York City. She splits her time between competing, teaching, judging and creating art performances with horses. With her mentor, the Colonel Christian Carde, she wrote and published Le Dressage et La Compétition (Belin, Paris, 2014). She graduated from the USDF L Program with distinction in 2018.



Tom Duggan grew up in Ireland in county Kildare, and trained under the Irish Horse Board as well as the British Horse Society. 
