From January through March, I was fully absorbed in the equestrian world. Going into the program, I was excited, nervous and full of expectations. Frequent vet and farrier visits taught me to think independently and to look out for my pony. When she came up lame, I had to adapt, and make the most out of my time, despite being unable to ride. Finding a balance between schoolwork and riding proved to be a valuable lesson in time

management. The WIT program provided me an exceptional education that I will carry with me for the rest of my life.
