What's offered?

The top 3 Individual Division scores make up the team score – no extra rides needed

CODE OF ETHICS

Dressage4Kids (D4K) expects all individuals involved with D4K to uphold this code of ethics. These guiding principles are intended to act as a foundation for a respectful and learning-centered environment and are woven into D4K programs through experience and dialogue.

- ◆ The horse comes first: prioritize the welfare of the horse through thoughtful horsemanship and the humane treatment, care, and respect for the horse.
- ◆ Commit to learning: embrace a growth mindset.
- ◆ Commit to a supportive environment: treat everyone with dignity, kindness, and fairness. Listen with respect and speak with honesty and kindness.
- ◆ Commit to good sportsmanship: reflect the positive values of courage, patience, good temper, humility, and generosity.
- ◆ Act with integrity: be honest, transparent, and responsible. Uphold D4K’s mission, values, and policies.
- ◆ Always strive to do what is right – for the horse and for each other.

EQUINE WELFARE

Riders (and trainers) are responsible for ensuring that their horses are sound and fit enough for competition. It is at the discretion of the judges to excuse a horse if they feel the horse is not sound or is struggling. Riders and trainers are responsible for ensuring the welfare of the horse throughout this event. Stable management will be inspecting stalls to ensure that they are clean and there is ample clean water, and that horses are comfortable.

- YDF Entry Agreement (signed)
- Negative Coggins (within 12 months)
- Proof of flu/rhino vaccinations (within 6 months)

REFUNDS

If classes are scratched and/or entire entry is withdrawn, in writing to the Entry Secretary (email is acceptable), by the closing date, July 19, 2026, a full refund less \$40 office fee will be provided. All refunds will be sent after the show. After July 19, 2026, there are no refunds. If a new entry is submitted to replace a withdrawn entry all funds may be transferred, less the \$40 office fee.

Post entries may be accepted to fill scratches at management's discretion with a \$40 office fee. Do not expect to be able to change entries after the closing date. Management reserves the right to combine, divide, or cancel classes.

INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Individual Division Championships are at the heart of the Lendon's Youth Dressage Festival. Each Division Championship consists of three Phases: Written Test (online during the Show), Dressage Test, and Equitation. Dressage tests for Division Championships must be ridden from memory – no readers/callers.

Total points from the three Phases (written/dressage/equitation) determine Division placings. Ties are broken by using the Equitation score, then the Dressage Test score, and, if needed, the Written Test score. A rider must complete all three Phases to be eligible for Division Championship Awards.

Divisions are split by level and by age group. For example, a rider competing in Training Level would compete against others at Training Level and of a similar age. Classes and Divisions may be split or combined at management's discretion.

Rider Age: The FEI age rule applies, which is the age the rider reaches in the calendar year. For example, if the rider turns 25 years old at any point during 2026, the rider is considered to be age 25 for the show.

Qualifying Score: There is no qualifying score requirement for the Individual Division Championships. Dressage4Kids wants this to be a fun environment for both horse and rider. Your horse should be comfortable staying overnight in a show environment and the rider should feel confident in their ability to ride their horse in a large show environment.

Horses: Please show concern for your horse and be aware of the amount of work in a show environment. Management reserves the right to limit the number of classes a horse enters.

Division Championships Entry Limits for Riders: A rider, with the exception of those entering the Walk/Trot or AA Introductory C Divisions, can enter a maximum of two Divisions. A rider in the Walk/Trot or AA Introductory C Division can only enter one Division. A rider who has previously won a Division may not compete again on the same horse in that Division, with the exception of the Walk/Trot Division and the FEI Divisions. A rider may enter:

- a) one Division
- b) two consecutive Divisions with the same horse (for example Training Level and First Level)
- c) any two Divisions on two different horses (consecutive Divisions or not)
- d) one Division with two different horses

Riders entered in the Individual Division Championships may not enter the Horseless Division Championships. Riders are encouraged to enter Optional Classes.

Division Championships Dressage Test Phase:

The levels offered for the Individual Division Championships Dressage Test Phase include:

WT – Walk/Trot Division 2023 USDF Introductory Test B, to be ridden in the small arena, 20x40m. For riders who have never competed in a recognized competition where cantering is required. Although a rider may enter this Division with 2 different horses, riders in this division may not ride in any other division or class except for classes designated Walk/Trot only. Note: this Division is not eligible for the Overall Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Awards.

AA – Walk/Trot/Canter Division 2023 USDF Introductory Test C, to be ridden in the small arena 20x40m. For riders who have never competed at First Level or above. Although a rider may enter this Division with 2 different horses, riders in this Division may not ride in any other Division but may compete in optional classes.

Alumni Division:

A 3-Phased Alumni Division Championships for riders ages 26 (FEI age) or older who have competed at LYDF in the past. Riders may choose their level according to the Division levels offered above. For example, if a rider wants to ride at Training Level, they will ride Training Level Test 3. Alumni will also take a written test (online) and will ride a group equitation class with others in the Alumni Division. Note: this Division is not eligible for the Overall Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Awards or any Special Awards. Entries for the Alumni Division may be limited.

*Unofficial jog (aka horse inspection) will be on Friday at a time tbd. There is a 5 point penalty if the rider does not attend. To learn more about horse inspections (aka jogs), go to:

Para Equestrian (PE) Divisions:

PEA - Para Equestrian Division A – 2023 FEI PE Grand Prix Test A (previously known as Grade 1 Team Test) Open to riders with a permanent physical disability who have never competed in a FEI PE Championship Test for their classification grade, or at Training Level or above. *Riders in this Division may compete only in this Division.*

PEB – Para Equestrian Division B – Open to all riders with a permanent physical disability. Riders may choose to compete in the current FEI PE Grand Prix Test A (previously known as the Team Test) that is most appropriate for their skill level (Grades II thru V). Riders in this Division may also enter another Division which is considered the

equivalent, or consecutive level, of the Para Team Test being ridden, if qualified. Additional information for Para Equestrian Divisions A and B:

1. Riders must either include a copy of their FEI, USEF, or other national Dispensation Certificate, or other medical documentation which would be reviewed by the Show Committee to ensure the rider meets the minimum criteria for a physical disability. Riders with cognitive disabilities do not qualify to compete.
2. Compensating aids and special equipment used must follow the USEF/FEI rules and are subject to approval by the Show Committee.

Division Championships Written Test Phase:

For the written test phase, there are three age groups: Ages 11 and Under, Ages 12-15, and Ages 16-25. Your age is according to your FEI age. For example, if you turn 12 at any point during 2026, you are considered 12 for the entire year.

The written test is conducted online in a supervised testing environment at the Festival. The tests consist of multiple choice and true/false questions. Please note on entry if special test accommodations are needed and detail the type of support needed. Riders will be required to bring their own mobile device with the ability to connect to the internet.

26 and Older	There is no required reading for the Alumni Division. Questions will test general knowledge and trivia.

Division Championships Equitation Phase:

The Equitation Phase consists of group equitation classes, split by rider age and level. Riders will be asked to perform at the level of their Dressage Test, with that level's gaits. Movements from the level of the Dressage test may be requested by the judge if needed to determine final score. The rider's position and seat will be judged along with the correct use and effect of the aids. The rider's position will be judged as it relates to the horse's

balance, i.e., a rider with a classical hunt seat position would be acceptable at Training Level but not at Third Level. Riders competing in two Divisions will ride BOTH equitation classes. A rider/horse combination competing in a double bridle may choose to compete in a double bridle in their equitation class. Equitation classes may be split or combined at management's discretion.

HORSELESS DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Horseless Division is open only to competitors not entered in any other Division. Horseless Division Championship consists of three Phases: Written Test (online during the Show), Judging Sport Horse Conformation, and Judging Dressage. Total points from the three Phases determine Division placings. Ties are broken by using the Judging Dressage score, then the Judging Sport Horse Conformation score, and, if needed, the Written Test score. A rider must complete all three Phases to be eligible for Division Championship Awards. Classes and Divisions may be split or combined at management's discretion. Note: this Division is not eligible for the Overall Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Awards.

Horseless Division Championships Written Test Phase (Friday)

Same requirements as the Individual Championships (see page 9)

Horseless Division Championships Judging Sport Horse Conformation (Friday)

Class will be scored based on how closely the competitor's scores come to the scores of the appointed judge. Participants must bring their own clipboard with them (or something else suitable to use as a hard writing surface), along with a pen.

Horseless Division Championships Judging Dressage (Saturday)

Class will be scored based on how closely the competitor's scores come to the scores of the appointed judge. Participants must bring their own clipboard with them (or something else suitable to use as a hard writing surface), along with a pen.

TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

Kross Creek Farm Team Competition: Teams are made up of three or four riders of any level. The three highest Division scores count towards the final team score. This is not a separate ride.

Team members and team name must be declared on Entry or to the Show Secretary no later than 4 p.m. Friday, August 7th.

- A rider may be on only one team
- If the rider has entered 2 Divisions, the scores are used from the rider's higher Division
- A rider who enters 2 horses in the same Division must declare in advance which horse they want to be considered for the team score. If they do not declare by 4 p.m. Friday, we will use the score from the horse whose name comes first alphabetically
- Alumni Division may only form teams with other alumni riders
- Horseless Division may only form teams with other Horseless Division competitors

Riders who would like to be on a team but do not have one to join may check the "Wanna Be on a Team" box on their entry. "Wanna Be on a Team" riders will be randomly combined to form team(s). "Wanna Be on a Team" riders can check the Team Roster posted outside of the Show Office and submit any changes no later than 4 p.m. on Friday.

Note: Your “Team Name” does not need to be the same as your “Stabling Group”. Stabling Group is used to designate who you want to stable together. The Team Name is the name you want to use for the Team Competition.

OPTIONAL CLASSES

Optional Classes are open to all competitors entered in a Division. Competitors who are not entered in a Division may have the opportunity to participate in select optional classes, space permitting. These opportunities are intended for those wishing to gain experience or try a class in a fun and supportive environment. Availability may be limited; further details will be announced as they are finalized.

Schooling Show (Friday)

With the exception of the Pony Test of Choice classes, riders will compute their own final score – awards by percentage. A volunteer will be present to help you score your test. Tests may be picked up at the Ribbons and Awards Table. Test of Choice Pony Class Results will determine the National Dressage Pony Cup Awards (see Awards Section for details). Readers/callers are not permitted in the schooling show dressage classes.

Schooling Show Classes Notes:

- WDAA tests will not be permitted in the Pony and Horse Test of Choice Classes.
- Riders should only enter the Horse Test of Choice class for a test that is not otherwise offered in the schooling show (ie Training Level Test 2).

Judging Sport Horse Conformation (Friday), Class JHC

Included in the Horseless Division, optional for everyone else. No horse needed. Class will be scored based on how closely the competitor’s scores come to the scores of the appointed judge. Handler Class (Friday), Class HDL

Presenting a horse or pony on a Triangle. Each entry will include a horse, a lead handler and a whip handler. All handlers must wear helmets. This in-hand class on the triangle will be judged on the lead handler and the whip handler based on how they work together as a team. For more information go to:

Written Test (Friday)

For competitors not entered in a Division. Competitors may enter the Written Test as an optional class. Same requirements as the Division Championships Written Test Phase. Refer to page 9.

Judging Dressage Class (Saturday)

Included in the Horseless Division, optional for everyone else. No horse needed. Class will be scored based on how closely the competitor's scores come to the scores of the appointed judge. Participants must bring their own clipboard with them (or something else suitable to use as a hard writing surface), along with a pen.

Quadrille Class (Friday), Class QC

Team of 4 riders required. In a quadrille competition the main criteria is the team's performance as a cohesive group. Compulsory routines test the team's ability to perform required movements according to acceptable standards. Judges look for the teams to keep even spacing (from rider to rider), move and turn in synchrony and maintain alignment throughout the ride. Quadrilles from Introductory through First Level are offered at the Festival. A rider competing in a higher level Division may compete in a lower level quadrille. Each quadrille member should be able to perform the USDF/USEF dressage tests at the desired level. The quadrille tests are specific USDF tests. The quadrille tests and additional information about quadrilles in general are available through the USDF website at <https://www.usdf.org/education/other-programs/quadrille/>. Riders must specify the quadrille level they riding on their entry form. Quadrilles require much practice prior to the competition, please plan accordingly.

Leadline Class (Saturday)

Open to riders at least 4 years old but no older than 8. Rider to be led through the test, saluting at the beginning and end. No qualifying requirement. The test is posted at:

Dressage Trail Class (Saturday/Sunday)

Riders guide their horses through a preset pattern that demonstrates the practical goals of dressage training.

Class 3DT1 Sunday - Walk/Trot Only

Class 2DT2 Saturday - Includes canter, more difficult tests may include a bridge, backing a turn, small jump, etc.

Class 3DT2 Sunday - Includes canter, more difficult tests may include a bridge, backing a turn, small jump, etc.

Prix Caprilli Class (Friday & Sunday)

Dressage test with jumps, ridden in a standard dressage arena. Tests posted at:

Class 1PCI	Friday Introductory Level	Walk/Trot movements in a small arena (20X40) with crossrails no higher than 12". Open to riders competing Training Level and below.
Class 3PCI	Sunday Introductory Level	Walk/Trot movements in a small arena (20X40) with crossrails no higher than 12". Open to riders competing Training Level and below.
Class 1PCT	Friday Training Level	Training Level movements with jumps no higher than 2'. Open to all riders except Walk/Trot Division.
Class 3PCT	Sunday Training Level	Training Level movements with jumps no higher than 2'. Open to all riders except Walk/Trot Division.

Class 1PCF	Friday First Level	First Level movements with jumps no higher than 2'6". Open to all riders competing First Level and above.
Class 3PCF	Sunday First Level	First Level movements with jumps no higher than 2'6". Open to all riders competing First Level and above.

Turnout Inspection (Saturday)

Riders may present themselves for an inspection of horse, rider, and tack at the specified area. Riders who would like to participate must enter the Turnout Inspection Class. Riders must enter this class on their Festival entry through Horse Show Office (there is no cost to enter this class). There will be a sign-up sheet at the Volunteer's Table where riders can select a specific inspection time. Horse Show Office will assign the same class start time for all riders; however, each rider must sign up for an individual inspection time. For more information go to:

Costume Class (Saturday)

Unmounted class for both horses and humans. Can be an individual or group entry with a maximum of 6 people in the group. At least one member of the entry must have entered the Division Competition, but leadline entries and other support people such as siblings, parents, trainers may join in the fun.

Musical Freestyle Class (Sunday)

Class will be limited to 25 riders on a first come, first serve basis. Riders may ride any USDF, USEF or FEI Freestyle. Indicate level on entry. Please check USDF/FEI rules for requirements.

Cover Art Contest (Deadline July 1, 2026)

A drawing, photo, or graphic design by anyone 25 and under will be chosen for the cover of the Show Program. The artist does not have to be entered in the show. Other artwork submitted but not chosen for the cover will be included inside the program. All drawings should be no larger than 8" x 11", must be vertical (like the front of a book) and can be in color or black/white. Photos must be vertical and sent electronically at 300 dpi at 100% of the size; if it is a smaller photo, the resolution needs to be higher. Do not include words or numbers in drawings (except logical dressage show word/numbers, such a bridle number or arena letters), but do sign them at the bottom. Tack Room Decorating Competition:

Stall Areas/Tack Rooms will be judged on set-up, cleanliness, and originality. Emphasis will be placed on originality. No flammable materials or lights. Do not attach items to stall panels using staples, screws, or any type of permanent adhesive. If tape is used, it must be removable, leave no residue, and be secured in a manner that prevents damage to the stall panels. To request stabling together, use the Entry Form and the same stable name. Judging will take place on Saturday at a time to be announced.

Pinch of Luck:

Inspired by a beloved tradition at Irish dance majors, Lendon's Youth Dressage Festival will share the fun with a "Pinch of Luck" tradition that celebrates good sportsmanship and connection. Pins are meant to be decorated, so bring your creativity and make each one your own. Decorating the clothespins is half the fun – get together with your teammates before or during YDF and create your own "good luck" clothespins. Riders are then invited to anonymously clip a finished clothespin onto the tack stall, coat bag, or gear of another YDF rider they don't already know. Recipients can keep the "pinch of luck" as a memento or pass the luck along, spreading encouragement and community throughout the Festival.

Scavenger Hunt:

Open to all competitors. The Show Program that you will receive from the Show Office when you check-in will include all of the details needed to participate in the Scavenger Hunt. Use the Show Program to track down your answers and fill in each square on your Scavenger Hunt Card. Once you have completed your Card, bring it to Lendon Gray in the Show Office by 4pm Saturday in order to be entered into the Prize Drawing.

Ride On The Side:

In the Pavilion, time to be announced at the Festival. A judge will discuss rides from the judge's point of view allowing questions and discussion. All are welcome to attend including competitors, families and trainers.

Stable Management Challenge (Saturday):

The two top scorers in the Written Test in the 12-15 and 16-25 age groups who are entered in the Individual Division Championships (not including the Horseless Division) will be invited to participate in a practical Stable Management test which may include a check of their stall care, putting on bandages, recognizing good quality feed, fitting a saddle and other management skills. COMPETITOR VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENT

All competitors must volunteer for at least 1 hour during the show. After you have: 1) arrived and stabled your horse, 2) received your packet from the Show Secretary, and 3) checked your ride times, go to the Volunteer Booth for your assignment(s). Competitors need to know their ride times and warm-up requirements before coming to the volunteer booth to sign up for their volunteer hour. Parents may accompany the competitor but riders must sign-up for their own task, including communicating to the volunteer staff.

STABLING

Arrival: starting Thursday, August 6 at noon (early arrival may be available for an additional fee)

Departure: by Sunday, August 9 at 5pm (late departure may be available for an additional fee)

Stabling is in permanent 10x10 stalls (board on bottom and chain link on top) with full doors. If your horse would be more comfortable in a double stall (10 x 20), you may request one, for an additional fee. Riders requesting adjoining stalls must use the same stable name (not team name) on all Entries. You may not change stalls after you arrive. Management will make every effort to space stabling assignments to minimize direct contact between unfamiliar horses. Competitors are welcome to bring plywood and/or tarps to create additional separation between their assigned stalls, as long as they are installed safely and do not damage the stalls.

Please note: In the Stabling section of the Entry - The Stable Group is the name that all riders who want to stable together will give. This may be different than the "Team Name" for the team competition.

Night Check: There will be night security during the show at no extra charge. Please make sure to include emergency contact information on your stall cards.

In the interest of safety, aisles must be kept clear (NO bikes in the aisles or anywhere near where horses go) and there must be plenty of room for two horses to pass one another. It is at the discretion of Dressage4Kids and its volunteers to mandate that you move something for safety reasons.

Shavings can be pre-ordered on your online entry. Shavings are \$12 per bag. Each stall requires approximately 3 or 4 bags to bed it. There will be limited availability for shavings at the show.

There will be no hay available at the show.

Stalls do NOT need to be stripped before leaving the show grounds.

PROOF OF EQUINE VACCINATION

It is a requirement that every horse be vaccinated against the Equine Influenza, EHV1 and EHV4 vaccines within 6 months of the Festival. If a vaccination will expire during the Festival, the horse must receive the vaccination 14 days prior to the start of the Festival. Submit proof of vaccination, along with negative Coggins dated within 12 months, at time of entry by uploading documents to Horse Show Office.

AWARDS INFORMATION

Division Championships, Team Championships and Class Ribbons:

To be eligible for Division Championship and Grand/Reserve Champion Awards, riders must complete all three sections of the Division: Written Test, Dressage, and Equitation. The Walk/Trot Division and the Horseless Division are not eligible for the Overall Champion or Overall Reserve Champion Awards.

Management makes every effort to give appropriate prizes/awards to placeholders. Once given, it becomes the responsibility of the recipient. Management will not replace lost or stolen prizes including gift certificates. Awards and ribbons must be picked up in person and will not be mailed.

Unless noted otherwise, riders must be entered in the Individual Division Championships and the highest score means the overall highest score of all three Sections: Dressage Test, Equitation Class, and Written Test. Walk/Trot riders are only eligible to receive awards noted by #. If the award is marked with an ** you must apply for this award with your festival entry through Horse Show Office and satisfy the documentation requirements of the award. If it is an award for a specific breed, you must provide copy of the horse's breed papers. **You will not be considered for the award if the documentation is not received by August 1.** All other special awards will be automatically entered if they apply to you. Riders must verify their Award Application against the posted Award Application Report and notify the Show Secretary of any discrepancies by Friday 4PM.

- American Connemara Pony Society Perpetual Award – highest scoring rider on a Connemara.**
- Anflug-Eilers Perpetual Trophy – Highest scoring rider in the Equitation phase ages 17 and under
- Big Ben Memorial Award (\$100 cash award) – Highest scoring rider aged 18 to 25 in the Written Test.
- Cadanz Perpetual Trophy – Highest scoring rider in the FEI YR Dressage Phase.
- Carol Lavell Award - Highest scoring rider in the Musical Freestyle.
- The Cirinity Michelle Perpetual Trophy - Highest scoring rider in any Division riding a Friesian.**
- The Clovis Horsemanship Award - Award includes \$250 plus one year supply of Triple Crown Feed (not to exceed 40 bags) after the receipt of a scholarship report detailing how the winner used the \$250 for educational purposes. Horses who have overcome large medical obstacles are eligible for this award. Rider must submit a written document with their entry briefly explaining the horse's health issues, along with their medical, nutritional, and psychological needs and how the rider helps care for the horse mentally and physically for the horse to stay happy in its work. The winner will be the highest scoring rider (Division Score) of those who qualify. The same horse/rider combination will not be eligible the year immediately following the year in which they won. The horse would be eligible with a different rider, and the rider would be eligible with a different horse. - Lindsay S. Jacob Memorial Trophy – Highest scoring rider in the Equitation phase in the age 18-21 Division.
- Miss Jane Marple Memorial Trophy – Highest scoring rider in the Para Equestrian divisions.
- Orchard Hill's Andalusian/Lusitano Perpetual Trophy – Highest scoring rider on a PRE, Andalusian or Lusitano.**

Award Times - Management will do their best to inform riders about award times, but it is the riders' responsibility to be on time for awards. No awards will be mailed. With the exception of Team Awards and Leadline, riders will pick up ribbons at the Ribbons and Awards Table. The Leadline Class will be awarded in the ring at the end of the Class and the Team Awards will be awarded at the Parade of Teams.
