Blue-color sections below indicate additional information that should be included on the entry form.

Welfare of the Horse Riders (and trainers) are responsible for ensuring that their horses are sound and fit enough for competition. It is at the discretion of the judges to excuse a horse if they feel the horse is not sound or is struggling. Riders and trainers are responsible for ensuring the welfare of the horse throughout this event. Stable management will be inspecting stalls to ensure that they are clean and there is ample clean water, and that horses are comfortable.

Who May Compete

Age (through age 25): The FEI age rule applies, which is the age the rider reaches in the calendar year. For example, if the rider becomes 25 years old in 2025, the rider is eligible, but if the rider becomes 26 years old in 2025, the rider is not. If the rider turns 12 anytime in the year 2025, the rider is considered to be 12 for the show. Riders ages 26 and older are eligible for the Alumni Division only (see the Divisions section for more information).

Qualifying Score: There is no qualifying score requirement for this year! D4K wants this to be a fun and low pressure environment for both horse and rider. Your horse should be comfortable staying overnight in a show environment and the rider should feel confident in their ability to ride their horse in a large show environment

Rider A rider may enter: 1) one Division, 2) two consecutive Divisions with the same horse, or 3) two Divisions on two different horses (consecutive Divisions or not), or 4) one Division with 2 different horses. A rider, with the exception to those entering the Walk/Trot or AA Introductory C Divisions, can enter a maximum of two Divisions (levels). A rider in the Walk/Trot or AA Introductory C Division can only enter one Division. A rider who has previously won a Division may not compete again on the same horse in that Division, with the exception of the Walk/Trot Division and the FEI Divisions. Riders are also encouraged to enter optional classes.

Horses: Please show concern for your horse and be aware of the amount of work in high heat. Management reserves the right to limit the number of classes a horse enters.

Divisions

The Divisions are the heart of the Youth Dressage Festival. Each Division consists of three Sections: Written Test (Friday late afternoon) and Dressage/Equitation Class (Saturday). Each Section is worth 100 points for a total of 300 points. Total points from the three sections determine placings. Ties are broken by using the Equitation score, then Dressage Test score and, if needed, the Written. Rider must complete all 3 Sections to be eligible for Division Awards.

Divisions (continued)

For example, for Division #11, the rider will have a written test in their age group, ride in a group equitation class with other riders of their Division, and ride the First Level Test 2 dressage test. A rider entering one of the FEI Divisions rides the Team dressage test of that level. Classes and Divisions may be split or combined at management's discretion.

Reminder: Because Divisions are split by level and age group, the number of riders in a Division may vary.

Dressage Test Section (readers are not permitted):

WT – Walk/Trot Division 2023 USDF Introductory Test B, to be ridden in the small arena, 20x40m. For riders who have never competed in a recognized competition where cantering is required. Although a rider may enter this Division with 2 different horses, riders in this division may not ride in any other division or class except for a Walk/Trot class or TOC Class in the Friday Schooling Show and optional mounted classes where there is no canter involved such as Dressage Trail for Walk/Trot, Prix Caprilli Walk/Trot and Quadrille Class (Introductory level). Note: this Division is not eligible for the Overall Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Awards.

AA – Walk/Trot/Canter Division 2023 USDF Introductory Test C, to be ridden in the small arena 20x40m. For riders who have never competed at First Level or above. Although a rider may enter this Division with 2 different horses, riders in this Division may not ride in any other Division but may compete in optional classes.

(NEW FOR 2025) Alumni Division

A 3-phased division for riders ages 26 or older who competed at LYDF in the past. Riders may choose their level according to the Division levels offered. For example, if a rider wants to ride at Training Level, they will ride Training Level Test 3. Alumni will also take a written test and will ride a group equitation class with others in the Alumni Division. Note: This Division is not eligible for the Overall Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Awards or any Special Awards. Entries for the Alumni Division may be limited.

Para Equestrian (PE) Divisions:

PEA - Para Equestrian Division A - 2023 FEI PE Grand Prix Test A (previously known as Grade 1 Team Test) Open to riders with a permanent physical disability who have never competed in a FEI PE Championship Test for their classification grade, or at Training Level or above. *Riders in this Division may compete only in this Division.*

PEB – Para Equestrian Division B_– Open to all riders with a permanent physical disability. Riders may choose to compete in the current FEI PE Grand Prix Test A (previously known as the Team Test) that is most appropriate for their skill level (Grades II thru V). Riders in this Division may also enter another Division which is considered the equivalent, or consecutive level, of the Para Team Test being ridden, if qualified. Additional information for Para Equestrian Divisions A and B:

- 1. Riders must either include a copy of their FEI, USEF, or other national Dispensation Certificate, or other medical documentation which would be reviewed by the Show Committee to ensure the rider meets the minimum criteria for a physical disability. Riders with cognitive disabilities do not qualify to compete.
- 2. Compensating aids and special equipment used must follow the USEF/FEI rules and are subject to approval by the Show Committee.

Written Test Section:

Consists of multiple choice or true/false questions. Please note on entry if special test accommodations are needed and detail the type of support needed. Written Test to be conducted online in a supervised testing environment at the Festival. Riders will be required to bring their own mobile device with the ability to connect to the internet.

Equitation Section:

This is a group class. The riders will be asked to perform at the level of their Dressage Test, with that level's gaits. Extra movements are not requested except where the judge feels the need for added input from the rider. The rider's position and seat will be judged along with the correct use and effect of the aids. The rider's position will be judged as it relates to the horse's balance, i.e., a rider with a classical hunt seat position would be acceptable at Training Level but not at Third Level.

Riders competing in two Divisions will ride BOTH equitation classes. Equitation classes may be split or combined at management's discretion. A rider/horse combination competing in a double bridle may also choose to compete in a double bridle in their equitation class.

Optional Classes

Entries will be limited – send your entries as early as possible. Entries for oversubscribed classes will be accepted in order of receipt.

Kross Creek Farm Team Competition

Teams are made up of three or four riders of any levels <u>including</u> the Walk/Trot Division. Highest three Division scores count. This is not a separate ride. A rider may be on only one team. If the rider has entered 2 Divisions, the scores are used from the rider's higher Division. A rider who enters 2 horses in the same Division must declare in advance which horse they want to be considered for the team score. If they do not declare by 4p.m. Friday, we will use the score from the horse who name comes first alphabetically.

Team members and team name must be declared on Entry or to the Show Secretary no later than 4 p.m. Friday, August 8th. Riders who would like to be on a team but do not have a team designated may check the "Wanna Be on a Team" box on their entry. "Wanna Be on a Team" riders will be randomly combined to form team(s). "Wanna Be on a Team" riders can check the Team Roster posted outside of the Show Office and submit any changes no later than 4 p.m. on Friday. Note: Your "Team Name' does not need to be the same as your "Stabling Group". Stabling Group is used to designate who you want to stable together. The Team Name is the name you want to use for the Team Competition. Riders entering the Alumni Division may only form teams with other alumni riders.

Schooling Show (Friday)

Riders will compute their own final score – awards by percentage. A volunteer will be present to help you score your test. Tests may be picked up at the Ribbons and Awards Table. TOC Pony Class Results will determine the National Dressage Pony Cup Awards (see Awards Section for details). Readers are not permitted.

Judging Sport Horse Conformation (Friday), Class JHC

No horse needed. Class will be scored based on how closely the competitor's scores come to the scores of the appointed judge. Handler Class (Friday), Class HDL

Presenting a horse or pony on a Triangle. Each entry will include a horse, a lead handler and a whip handler. All handlers must wear helmets. This in-hand class on the triangle will be judged on the lead handler and the whip handler based on how they work together as a team. Quadrille Class (Friday), Class QC

Team of 4 riders required. In a quadrille competition the main criteria is the team's performance as a cohesive group. Compulsory routines test the team's ability to perform required movements according to acceptable standards. Judges look for the teams to keep even spacing (from rider to rider), move and turn in synchrony and maintain alignment throughout the ride. Quadrilles from Introductory through First Level are offered at the Festival. A rider competing in a higher level Division may compete in a quadrille.

Each quadrille member should be able to perform the USDF/USEF dressage tests at the desired level. The quadrille tests are specific USDF tests. The quadrille tests and additional information about quadrilles in general are available through the USDF website at https://www.usdf.org/education/other-programs/quadrille/. Riders must specify the quadrille level they riding on their entry form. Quadrilles require much practice prior to the competition, please plan accordingly.

Leadline Class (Saturday)

Turn Out Inspection (Saturday) — Riders may present themselves before their first ride for an inspection of horse, rider, and tack at the specified area. Riders who would like to participate must enter the Turn Out Inspection Class. Rider must enter this class on their Festival entry through Horse Show Office. There is no cost to enter this class. There will be a sign-up sheet at the Volunteer's Table for riders to select a specific inspection time. It is recommended that riders select a time at least 15 minutes prior to their desired warm-up start time. Costume Class (Sunday)

Unmounted class for both horses and humans. Can be an individual or team entry with a maximum of 6 people to a team. At least one member of the entry must have entered the Division Competition, but leadline entries and other support people such as siblings, parents, trainers may join in the fun.

Other Competitions and Activities with No Entry Fee

Cover Art Contest (Deadline July 1, 2025)

A drawing or photo by anyone 25 and under will be chosen for the cover of the Show Program and possibly on show t-shirts. The artist does not have to be entered in the show. Other artwork submitted but not chosen for the cover will also be included inside the program. Drawings may be mailed or sent electronically. All drawings should be no larger than 8" x 11", must be vertical (like the front of a book) and can be in color or black/white. Photos must be vertical and sent electronically at 300 dpi at 100% of the size; if it is a smaller photo, the resolution needs to be higher.

Do not include words or numbers in drawings (except logical dressage show word/numbers, such a bridle number or arena letters), but do sign them at the bottom. Tack Room Competition: Teams or groups of riders who are stabled together may enter this competition. Stall Areas/Tack Rooms will be judged on set-up, cleanliness, and originality. Emphasis will be placed on originality. No flammable materials or lights. To request stabling together, use the Entry Form and the same stable name. Judging will take place TBD on Saturday.

Scavenger Hunt: Open to all competitors. The Show Program that you will receive from the Show Office when you check-in will include all of the details needed to participate in the Scavenger Hunt. Use the Show Program to track down your answers and fill in each square on your Scavenger Hunt Card. Once you have completed your Card, bring it to Lendon Gray in the Show Office by 4pm Saturday in order to be entered into the Prize Drawing.

Ice Cream Social: At a day and time to be determined. For competitors only.

Ride On The Side: Friday – In the Pavilion, exact time to be announced at the Festival. Margaret Freeman (S) will discuss rides from the judge's point of view allowing questions and discussion. All are welcome to attend including competitors, families and trainers.

Trainers Forum: Friday during the Written Test. Parents and trainers are encouraged to meet at the time and location TBD.

Stable Management Challenge (Saturday afternoon, exact time TBD): The two top scorers in the Written Test in the 12-15 and 16-25 age groups will be invited to participate in a practical Stable Management test which may include a check of their stall care, putting on bandages, recognizing good quality feed, fitting a saddle and other management skills. A list of riders qualifying for this competition will be posted outside of the Show Office by 9am Saturday.

- Overall Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Ribbons and Prizes.

Awards (continued)

To be eligible for Division and Grand/Reserve Champion Awards, riders must complete all three sections of the Division: Written Test, Dressage/Equitation Test. The Walk/Trot Division is not eligible for the Overall Champion or Overall Reserve Champion Awards.

Management makes every effort to give appropriate prizes/awards to placeholders. Once given, it becomes the responsibility of the recipient. Management will not replace lost or stolen prizes including gift certificates. Awards and ribbons must be picked up in person and will not be mailed.

National Dressage Pony Cup Awards - Using the scores from the Pony Test of Choice Class during Thursday's Schooling Show, ribbons for first through sixth places in each of the 3 groups will be awarded (groups TBD). An overall Champion and Reserve for the entire Pony Test of Choice Class will also be awarded. To find out more about the National Dressage Pony Cup program go to: https://dressageponycup.com/

Entries

<u>Entries may be limited at management's discretion</u>. Riders are encouraged to submit their entry on Entry Open Date or soon thereafter. Rider's complete entry MUST be received by the closing date.

Riders MUST specify their birth date on their entry. A negative Coggins Test dated within 12 months and proof of Equine Influenza, EH1 and EH4 within 6 months of the Festival must accompany entry.

Post entries may be accepted to fill scratches at management's discretion with a \$50 office fee. Do not expect to be able to change entries after the closing date. No refunds after closing date. A \$50 office fee will be charged for refunds made before closing date. Management reserves the right to combine, divide, or cancel classes.

Payment Methods: All entries will be online through **www.horseshowoffice.com**. Credit card payments will be accepted through the show entry software. **Entries will not be processed unless payment has been received.** Contact the Entry Show Secretary if you do not receive a confirmation.

Refunds

If classes are scratched and/or entire entry is withdrawn by the closing date, July 14, 2025, in writing to the Entry Secretary (email is acceptable), a full refund less \$50 office fee will be sent after the show. If the withdrawal is made by July 23, 2025 in writing to the Entry Secretary (email is acceptable), the refund will be for the cost of the stabling, and shavings. All refunds will be sent after the show. After July 23, 2025, there are no refunds. If a new entry is submitted to replace a withdrawn entry all funds may be transferred, less the \$50 office fee.

Stabling

No horses are to arrive before 12 noon on Thursday. Stabling in permanent 10x10 stalls with full doors (board on bottom and chain link on top). Riders requesting adjoining stalls must use the same stable name (not team name) on all Entries. You may not change stalls after you arrive.

In the interest of safety, aisles must be kept clear (NO bikes in the aisles or anywhere near where horses go) and there must be plenty of room for two horses to pass one another. It is at the discretion of Dressage4Kids and its volunteers to mandate that you move something for safety reasons.

Please note: In the Stabling section of the Entry - The <u>Stable Group</u> is the name that all riders who want to stable together will give. This may be different than the "Team Name" for the team competition.

Shavings can be pre-ordered on your online entry. Shavings are TBD per bag. Each stall requires approximately 3 or 4 bags to bed it. There will be no hay available at the show. There will be limited availability for shavings at the show.

Stalls do NOT need to be stripped before leaving the show grounds.

Stabling information: Stable Manager TBD

Proof of Equine Vaccination (VERY IMPORTANT)

It is a requirement that that every horse be vaccinated against the Equine Influenza, EH1 and EH4 vaccines within 6 months of the Festival. If a vaccination will expire during the Festival, the horse must receive the vaccination 14 days prior to the start of the Festival. Submit proof of vaccination, along with negative Coggins, at time of entry by uploading documents to Horse Show Office.

Offset Stabling Costs With Advertising Credits

Competitors may solicit as many ads as they wish for the electronic show program. Competitors will receive credit for stabling costs as follows:

There is a limit of \$150 credit per competitor regardless of how many ads the competitor solicits or the size/cost of the ads. However, please remember that revenue from ads helps offset the costs of the Festival, allowing Dressage4Kids to keep show fees lower and to direct more proceeds into the scholarship funds.

Ads must comply with the guidelines detailed in the Earn Credits Toward Stabling page on the Youth Dressage Festival website. Payment and ads must be received by June 25, 2025. There are no exceptions.

Rules

Competitor's Volunteer Requirement: All competitors MUST volunteer for at least 1 hour during the show. AFTER you have: 1) arrived and stabled your horse, 2) received your packet from the Show Secretary, and 3) checked your ride times, go to the Volunteer Booth for your assignment(s). Competitors need to know their ride times and warm up requirements before coming to the volunteer booth to sign up for their volunteer hour. Parents may accompany the competitor but riders must sign-up for their own task, including communicating to the volunteer staff.

Attire: Riders may wear traditional show attire. Informal attire (short or long-sleeved collared shirts(no tee-shirts) is also acceptable in the performance arena in place of traditional show attire. Teams may want to have matching shirts. All riders must wear proper attire when mounted. ASTM/SEI-approved helmets are required for ALL riders when mounted. Helmets will also be required for all Handler Class entries and those handling the demo horses for the Sport Horse Conformation Class. The wearing of an improper helmet, including an improperly fitted helmet (e.g. loose chin straps), is grounds for disqualification. Whips and blunt spurs are allowed. Judges may deduct up to two points for messy attire in the performance arena. Award recipients must be in neat competition attire (unmounted) to receive their Division awards.

Bridle Numbers: Horses must wear a bridle number at all times when out of the stall.

Tack and Bits must follow USEF dressage rules with exception to Prix Caprilli classes. Bits used in competition must be the same bits used in the warm-up immediately preceding the competition. Draw reins are not permitted at any time on the show grounds. Horse boots and/or polos are allowed in warm-up areas. The Show Management reserves the right to inspect any rider and their equipment at any time for compliance with the show rules. Non-compliance will be grounds for disqualification.

Schooling is permitted only when the Show Office is open. Please refer to the Tentative Schedule on the next page. Trainers may school competitor horses on Thursday and Friday only and must sign a Release at the Show Office prior to riding. Any violation to this rule may result in the disqualification of the competitor.

No coaching is allowed any time while the rider is competing. Any rider receiving coaching while in the competition ring will be disqualified whether the rider requested such assistance or not. Any visual, verbal, or otherwise vocal communication with the rider is considered coaching.

Readers are not permitted for the Schooling Show on Friday or the Dressage/Equitation division classes on Saturday. Readers are permitted in the Trail, Prix Caprilli, and Quadrille classes.

Lunging is only permitted in designated areas.

Ring stewards are there to ensure the correct horse/rider is in front of the judge and the ring is running in a timely manner. The riders need to know in what ring they ride, their times, and the numbers of the riders ahead of them. Do not ask the stewards.

An adult must supervise all young children at all times.

Golf carts or any motorized vehicle (i.e. scooters) brought to the show may be operated only by licensed drivers.

Parking Five points may be taken off the final score of any rider whose vehicle is parked in illegal parking areas. Two-horse trailers will be allowed 15 minutes to unload; larger vehicles will be allowed one-half hour to unload. After these times, all vehicles will have to be moved to parking areas. All trailers must be parked in the Campground area.

Dogs must be leashed and kept quiet in stabling and riding areas.

Infractions of any rules may be cause for elimination or up to a 5-point penalty at the discretion of management.

Other Information

Award Times - Management will do their best to inform riders about award times, but it is the riders' responsibility to be on time for awards. No awards will be mailed. With exception to Team Awards and Leadline, riders will pick up ribbons at the Ribbons and Awards Table. The Leadline Class will be awarded in the ring at the end of the Class. .

Special Awards - Winners will be posted by the Show Office on the score board as they become available. Once winners are posted, they can pick up their award at the "Awards" Location. A photographic opportunity will be available.

Tentative Times - Times and important additional information will be posted on the <u>Dressage4Kids website</u> one week prior to the show, but are subject to change. Official times will be posted by 7 a.m. on each show day.

Roving Trainers: Our wonderful professionals volunteer their time for any competitor without a trainer who wishes help. Please contact Lendon Gray at graydressage@gmail.com, preferably prior to the show. If you need to sign up while at the show, there will be a sign-up sheet at the Volunteer Table, but individual times and particular trainers are not guaranteed.

Other Information (continued)

Arenas: All arenas and warm-up are on a sand/bluestone mixture with exception to the indoor which is sand/clay mixture. Lunging allowed in the lunging ring only.

Education and Entertainment: There will be demonstrations throughout the show. Watch for notices posted and listen for announcements regarding the days and times of activities. There may be opportunities to "Sit with the Judge" and to practice judge.
