

U.S. FEI Junior Dressage Riders Invited to Compete at CDIJ Mexico

U.S. FEI Junior dressage riders are invited to take part in an international competition at the upcoming CDIJ Mexico, November 7-9, 2025, just outside Mexico City. This special event brings together riders from across North, Central, and South America. The competition organizers will provide horses for the Juniors and mixed-nation teams will compete together. More than just a competition, the CDIJ Mexico offers riders the chance for international camaraderie and cultural exchange.

U.S. participants will be selected based on 2025 scores from S or FEI-level judges, as well as demonstrated experience riding a variety of horses. An experienced American FEI coach will be available for the American riders.

Junior riders may arrive at the venue by October 26 for the horse draw on Monday, October 27. Riders unable to attend the draw in person may participate via Zoom. While riders may opt to bring their own horse, it is important to note that there are additional health requirements, including precautions related to screwworm. The competition itself will run from November 7-9. The cost to enter will be approximately \$2,000 (includes the cost to borrow a horse plus the entry fees) plus travel and accommodations.
